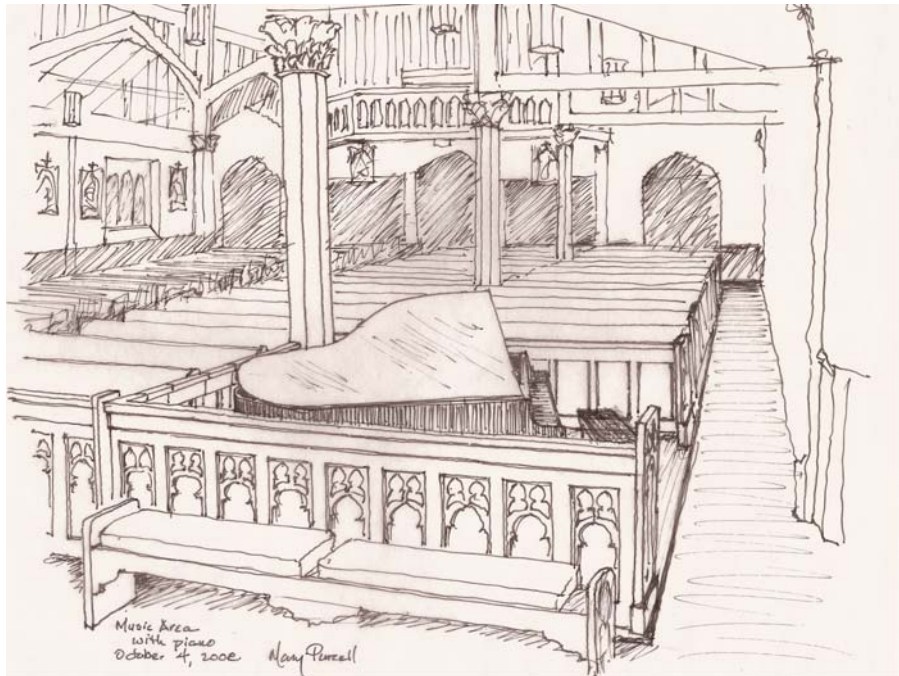
**We are sharing a bus with St. Thomas Aquinas Parish.
