WELCOME VISITORS! We are delighted that you have joined us at The Shrine of the Sacred Heart this weekend and we offer you a "hearty" welcome.



The beautiful feasts of All Saints and All Souls are coming! All Saints Day is next Sunday. We will observe the feast at all our Masses next weekend. All Souls Day is Monday, November 2. The Mass for All Souls will be in the chapel at 7AM. Masses for the faithful departed will be celebrated throughout the month of November. If you wish to have someone included in these Mass intentions please carefully print the names on the All Souls envelopes and return them to the office. In addition, a Book of Remembrance will be placed in the sanctuary during the month of November.

First Friday is November 6. Masses will be at 7AM, 11AM (school) and 6PM (with Sacred Heart devotions). The chapel will be open throughout the day for visits and prayer. Please enter the chapel through the garden door. Morning Prayer will be at 6:40AM. Reconciliation will be available at 5PM. The Holy Hour with adoration and Evening Prayer will begin in the chapel at 5PM. The faithful departed of our parish who have died in the last year will be especially remembered at the 6PM Mass. Please invite your friends to join you in prayer on the next First Friday.

All of the Catholic bishops of the United States will be in Baltimore for their annual meeting, November 15-18. They will be at the Marriott Waterfront hotel. DID YOU KNOW? Learn to 'STOP' inappropriate activity before it happens: Child safety tip: Teach your child to respect the word "stop!" Teach your preschooler that "stop" means "stop," and that your child has the right to stop people from touching his or her body. Obviously, exceptions will have to be made for doctors and parents, but even parents must listen when a child doesn't want to be tickled or hugged anymore. Reinforcing this excellent lesson gives your child the power to recognize—and to stop—"bad touching" by others if it should happen.
