From our pastor, Msgr. Cramblitt...

THREE WEEKS FROM TODAY the Sunday morning religious education classes will begin for the 2010-2011 season. These are the religion classes for children in pre-school through 8th grade. If you have children in this age group they should be enrolled in this program! Registration is required and you may register by calling Bernetta at the parish office (410-466-6884 x14). If you have not registered your children please do so right away! We need to arrange for text books and class rosters, etc.

Summer is winding down but it isn't over yet! There are still wonderful days left to enjoy the summer break from school or work. If you do go away please remember your weekly stewardship pledge to The Shrine! We depend on your steady weekly stewardship to manage our parish. If you miss a weekend please make up for the weekend you were away. Thank you!

Changes are coming in the liturgy! The new Roman Missal will go into usage in about a year. When the missal begins to be used there will be noticeable changes in the Mass. Some of the prayers and responses will be different and all of us will need to learn the new wording. The English language version of the Missal has not been revised since the late 1960's when the entire Mass was translated from Latin usage into English usage. The changes this time will not be near as drastic. They are designed to make the English language Mass be a more accurate translation to the official Latin text of the Mass, and to bring a greater dignity to the language of our worship. I encourage you to look at the website www.usccb.org/romanmissal. This is the website prepared by the US bishop's conference. You will be able to click on "sample texts" and see the kind of changes that are coming. It is my hope that our parish will be well prepared for these changes and that the translation will be smooth! This new Missal has been many years in coming and now that it will soon be in place I hope we will all embrace it with great energy.
